About the Yorkshire Air Ambulance

It's a common misconception that **Yorkshire Air Ambulance** is government funded. We are not.

Yorkshire Air Ambulance relies solely on the generosity of individuals and organisations to help save lives across the region, and it costs **£19,000** a day to keep our helicopters airborne.

In fact, as an independent Charity, we only receive help through the secondment of the paramedics from Yorkshire Ambulance Service NHS Trust. Yorkshire Air Ambulance fly daily with a crew consisting of a highly trained Pilot, a Critical Care Consultant level Doctor with experience in A&E and an anaesthesia specialism, and two Critical Care Paramedics.

As a rapid response emergency service, our air ambulances serve a population of five million people across four million acres. Our two air ambulances operate from Nostell Priory near Wakefield in West Yorkshire and RAF Topcliffe near Thirsk in North Yorkshire, covering the whole of Yorkshire seven days a week, 365 days per year. Last year (2021-2022) the Yorkshire Air Ambulance responded to 1,701 incidents across Yorkshire and treated 1211 patients.

Fundraising Volunteer

This role is an 'all-rounder' and ideal if you are interested in assisting with a variety of events to help raise funds and awareness of the Charity. You will be attending community events as a representative of the YAA and typical duties include: working on and setting up a stall, attending a cheque presentation, collecting tins, bucket collections at a supermarket or wearing our mascot



Community Event Volunteer

As a Community Event Volunteer, you will predominantly be helping with the set up and management of stalls across the region with our official merchandise on offer and accepting donations. These are in a large variety of locations, outdoor events or inside venues such as shopping centres and supermarkets. The events we attend are lots of fun and no two days are the same. Our staff and volunteers always get a warm welcome wherever we go.



Public Speaker

Our speakers attend numerous locations in their area to talk to a variety of groups about the lifesaving work of the YAA. Full training, equipment and an informative presentation will be provided. Our talks are extremely popular with many community groups, businesses and organisations. This could also include a shorter speech at a cheque presentation or at a dinner.



Collecting Tin Steward

Our Collecting Tin Stewards visit many shops and businesses across the region as our tins are a substantial income for the Charity. The role will also include counting and banking of these funds as well as ensuring the paperwork is completed correctly.
